2014 is going to be an exciting year for the City of Rockford!

The Capital Improvement Project involving Maplewood Manor is going well. All the televising of pipes has been completed and we are ready to get bids for the project.

We have signed a purchase agreement to buy the mall on the West side of town, where we plan to market any vacant space, develop the event center and relocate city hall offices. On February 20th we held a public hearing to approve the financing for this project. Next to happen is the issuing of bonds and the closing in April.

There is a committee working on replacing the existing Lion's building in Riverside Park with a picnic shelter, kitchen and restrooms by the end of this year.

Our water and sewer budgets are being reviewed to determine what rate adjustments are needed to address future water and sewer projects.

I am very excited to announce we hired a new Administrator, Dan Madsen, who has worked at the City of Madelia for 6 years. Welcome Dan!

At the end of March we will say goodbye to our Administrator, Nancy Carswell, who has dedicated 29 years to the City of Rockford. Thank you Nancy for your commitment to us and I wish you all the best in your retirement!

We have a lot to do this year and look forward to your support. Keep smiling—it might melt some of the snow!

RECYCLING

Wright Recycling collects recycling every other Wednesday. The 2014 calendar is available on the City website or at City Hall. Two sort program: glass/cans/plastic bottles can be put together and paper. Cardboard should be flattened and no larger than 3 x 3. If you need a recycling bin stop by City Hall. **Recyclables must be set out at the curb by 7 a.m. The next scheduled pick up is: MARCH 19, 2014. See dates to follow:**

The compost site on Elm Street/CR 33 is scheduled to open to City of Rockford Residents on Tuesday, April 15th, depending on the weather.

You do not need to check out a key at city hall.

Hours of operation:
Monday-Friday 7:30am-3:00pm
Wednesday Evening 4:30-8:30pm
Saturday 8:00am-noon

Items accepted: grass clippings, leaves and brush no larger than 3" in diameter. All bags used to transport composting must be removed.
NO OTHER DUMPING IS ALLOWED.

Finished compost material is also available at no charge.
