WASTEWATER BILLING CALCULATION (ACTUAL VS. AVERAGING) OPEN UNTIL DECEMBER 31, 2016

Historically wastewater rates had only been calculated based on the average water used between November 15th and April 15th and recalculated annually. In 2014 the City Council passed an ordinance to allow residents the choice between being billed for their wastewater use based upon their actual water use or continuing with the old system which averaged winter water use and billed that average as the wastewater usage over the summer months.

All residents in Rockford are assigned the averaging billing system for wastewater unless you contact City Hall between **December 1st and December 31st**, with the change effective for the January billing. This is the only time you can change your wastewater billing calculation.

If you do not want to be billed based upon your assigned system you can change your billing system by **contacting City Hall before Friday, December 30, 2016**. Annually you can change your wastewater billing system in December.

CHRISTMAS TREE PICK-UP

If you would like to have your tree picked-up on January 18, 2017, you **MUST** call City Hall by noon on **Wednesday, January 11, 2017** to sign-up. If there is not a minimum of 10 participants, Waste Management will not be able to facilitate the collection of trees! The cost is \$10 and will be billed to your account.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Welcome to Winter!

As we enter December, City Staff are preparing year end reports for 2016 and finalizing budgets for 2017. We will have a Truth in Taxation hearing at 6 p.m. on Tuesday, December 13th, 2016 in the Council Chambers in City Hall to discuss next year's proposed budgets, receive comments from the community and answer any questions people may have about our plans for the upcoming year.

The City Council has proposed a preliminary property tax increase of 1.8% for 2017 that is reflected in the property tax notices that have been sent out from Wright and Hennepin Counties. Additionally, the City Council will also be reviewing the Water and Wastewater Utility budgets at our meeting on December 13th, 2016. As it stands, the Wastewater Utility and rates appear stable, while the Water Utility and rates will likely need adjusting. Based upon our initial review, any necessary adjustment or increase in the Water rate will remain in the single digit percentages per 1,000 gallons used. We will have information and reports posted on the City's website and Facebook page regarding the city's finances in early December.

Also of note, City Staff recently completed decorating the streets for this Winter, with the youth skating rink and hockey rink scheduled to be completed in early December. We are proud of the way our city and downtown area look, and we hope to have a lot of use of the skating and hockey rinks by our community over the winter.

From all of us, we wish you a merry and safe Holiday Season! As always, please stop by City Hall if you have any thoughts, comments or questions you would like to share. We like hearing from you.

'Tis Snow Plowing Season...

The City of Rockford's Public Works Department has a mapping system divided the city's street system into three (3) routes for snow and ice control. Within each of these areas, the City has classified city streets based on the street function, relative traffic volume, and importance to the welfare of the community. Those streets classified as priority "A" streets and will be plowed first. These are higher volume streets which connect major sections of the city and provide access for emergency fire, police, and medical service. The second priority streets "B" are those streets providing access to schools, homes and commercial businesses. The third "C" is low volume alleys parking lots.

The Street Department with the assistance of the Wright County Sheriff's Department, monitors street conditions and is responsible for making the decision to call out personnel and equipment to begin snow and ice control operations.

The Street Department has the responsibility of determining plow routes and sequencing of operations in accordance with priorities as established. Staff may adjust sequencing or route assignment based on storm conditions, equipment availability and/or other conditions warranting changes.

Did you know? The City of Rockford maintains approximately 18 miles of residential roads along with six miles of trails, four parking lots, alleys and other city owned properties.

On a typical snow fall (2-4 inches):

18 miles of residential roads: 3 staff (8-10 hours)

6 miles of trails, four parking lots, alleys and other city owned properties: 2 staff (6-8 hours)

As time permits—Public Works removes piles of snow from Main Street: 3 staff (6-8 hours)

A fully loaded tandem axle plow truck (one set of wheels in the back) can weigh up to 50,000 pounds.

Stay back 500' from snow plow vehicles.

In addition to being on call to snowplow, every public works staff member rotates on-call duty (Wednesday until Tuesday). During this time they do required tests at the wastewater plant and verify operations. Employees also do required water testing, checks lift stations & pump house, visual of the city, and check phone mes-

sages. Additionally the employee is responsible for other occupational duties and respond to Public Works emergencies.

Mayor Hafften stated "Our dedicated Public Works staff can be called in any time of the day or night, 7 days a week, to plow snow, deal with a broken water main or other emergencies. I am extremely grateful for their commitment to ensure the safety of our community."

Public Works Director Trevor Brummer noted "the staff appreciate hearing positive feedback from the community".

- Shaving uses 3-5 gallons (tap on).

Unused running water is like connecting a drain to your tap; wasting water!
