Crow River Food Co-op



The Crow River Food Co-op continues to get out in the community to increase awareness about the efforts being made to open a local grocery store in the Rockford area. There are currently 148 members to date and our goal is to have 500 members before we open the doors. This summer we served free root beer floats at the Movies in the Park, attended National Night Out, participated in the River Days parade, and every Saturday attended the Community Market in Delano. Members will be going out door to door this fall to increase our membership. The co-op has received a grant from Allina Healthy Communities which will be used to fund neighborhood cookouts to increase membership and to provide some healthy tips to the participants. The Crow River Food Co-op holds their business meeting on the second Monday

of each month at 6:30 p.m. at the China Buffet (Lee's Kitchen) at the Rockford Mall. The group is talking about a fall event such as a community pot luck and a silent auction to help us raise money. We are also working on a video that will air on the website which will help answer some of the questions we hear from future members. If you have not yet joined please do so today, the one time membership is \$200 and the application is online, and is also available at the library, city hall, and Bank West. The local grocery store will strengthen our economy, spend your dollars locally for fresh fruits, vegetables, meats, etc.

Items accepted: grass clippings, leaves and brush no larger than 3" in diameter. All bags used to transport composting must be removed.

SIDEWALK SNOW REMOVAL

In the interest of public safety, the City of Rockford reminds you of the importance of keeping your walkways cleared of snow and ice. City Ordinance 901.04 states that all snow and ice must be removed from public sidewalks 24 hours after the snow or other precipitation causing the conditions.



The throwing or placing of snow or other material in the streets, sidewalks and other public ways is a public nuisance and an ordinance violation.

STORM SEWER SYSTEMS

Fall season is coming soon and with the fall weather the trees start shedding their leaves. In order to ensure that our storm sewers do not get clogged with leaves and debris we want to remind our residents to please remove the leaves from your property quickly if possible. The city and county storm sewers play an important role in removing rain from streets, sidewalks and driveways. **Please do not rake leaves into the gutters.**

The city also has storm water ponds in many of our newer developments which the public works staff maintains and inspects on a regular basis. These ponds are dredged on as needed basis to make sure that they drain adequately.

If you notice any frozen ice or accumulation of debris blocking the city storm sewers please contact Public Works at 763-477-4346. Thank you for taking pride in your property and for maintaining it properly.

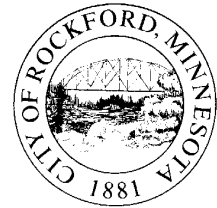

S N O W S E A S O N P A R K I N G

During the period from **November 1st to April 1st** it shall be unlawful for any person to **park a vehicle** on or **within six feet of the roadway** between the hours of **2 a.m. to 6 a.m.** and anytime after there has been ice accumulation, continuous or intermittent snow fall during which there has been **accumulation of two inches or more** of snow on any street until plowed or removed the whole width of the roadway. Vehicles parked in violation of this ordinance will be towed and stored at the owner's expense. **At NO TIME shall a vehicle be parked on ANY street from more than twelve (12) hours.**

SNOW PLOWING—It is unlawful to plow snow onto or across ANY city, township, county or state road. Doing so is a violation of state statute and you will be fined.
