ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

The new year so far has been busy. The city council held a special workshop to review a Capital Improvement Plan for the streets/water and sanitary sewer infrastructure. The plan calls for replacement of old water and sewer mains along with street overlays or bituminous removal. The plan if approved would begin in 2014 in the Maplewood Manor neighborhood as this area has older mains and experienced many water main breaks. The engineers presented a map showing all of the water main breaks over the past several years to help council determine which areas are higher risk. Staff will be meeting with our financial consultant to review the best method to finance these improvements.

The city held our fourth visioning session on February 5th regarding "branding" the community which was a second in this series. An important part of each vision session included speakers that provided some good information about the

HOUSEHOLD HAZARD WASTE



Do the products you use in your home pose a hazard to your drinking water? The fact is, many of the products used in the home—if not used, stored and disposed of properly—may find their way into your drinking water supply. Some examples of these products include aerosol cleaners, bug spray, charcoal lighter fluid, fertilizer with weed killer, pesticides, used motor oil, batteries and fluorescent lights. Even small amounts of hazardous chemicals contained in many of these products can be hazardous to you, your family, and the environment. Improperly used, stored, or disposed of household products containing hazardous chemicals have the potential to enter the area's groundwater aquifer by infiltrating from the land surface through the soils.

The City is working cooperatively with the County solid waste office and homeowners to implement preventative measures to help protect the drinking water of its residents.



SIMPLE STEPS YOU CAN DO TO PROTECT YOUR DRINKING WATER

- Check your kitchen, basement, and garage. If any labels contain any of these words: **CAUTION. WARNING. DANGER. POISON.** Those products may contain hazardous chemicals.
- Keep track of the products used in your household and keep a minimum supply on hand.
- Ensure that the products in your household are stored in a safe place and according to manufacturer's instructions.
- If you have unwanted products that contain hazardous chemicals
 - **–DON'T** throw them in the garbage!
 - **–DON'T** pour them down the drain!
 - **–DON'T** pour them down the storm water drain!
 - **–DON'T** pour them on the ground!
- Always be sure to follow the manufacturer's instructions when using products containing hazardous chemicals. Follow all MN Pollution Control Agency requirements and recommended practices concerning the disposal of products containing hazardous chemicals

Event Center Update

The old park building known as the Lions Building is in a dilapidated state and the city has been discussing replacing this building with a new event center. The city established a Committee to review construction of an Event center that would seat 300 people. The City hired CPMI Construction Management Co. last fall and after a few workshop meetings with the city council and the committee they provided costs for the project. The latest cost for a pre-engineered building with all of the administration/site work/labor/materials is \$1.6 million. The city council asked the committee to review the elements of the building and find areas where we can make changes to bring the cost down to \$1.3 million. With this done, the staff along with our financial consultant will discuss the potential tax impact of this building along with other CIP plans, for streets, water, and wastewater. The council will discuss this financial information at a workshop meeting on March 18th.

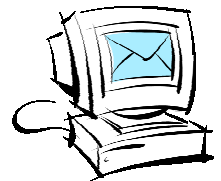
Jim Thome Park (Parkwood neighborhood)

COMPOST SITE

The compost site on Elm Street/CR 33 is scheduled to open to City of Rockford Residents on Monday, April 15th, depending on the weather. You do not need to check out a key at city hall.

Hours of operation:
Monday-Friday 7:30am-3:00pm
Wednesday Evening 4:30-8:30pm
Saturday 8:00am-noon

Items accepted: grass clippings, leaves and brush no larger than 3” in diameter. All bags used to transport composting must be removed.
NO OTHER DUMPING IS ALLOWED.

Finished compost material is also available at no charge.

RECYCLING INFORMATION

Wright Recycling collects recycling every other **Wednesday**. The 2013 calendar is available on the City website or at City Hall. Two sort program: glass/cans/plastic bottles can be put together and paper. Cardboard should be flattened and no larger than 3 x 3. If you need a recycling bin stop by City Hall.
